The meeting was opened to the public for comments:

Robert and Terry Thomas filed a complaint regarding the condition of Banocy Road. A discussion was held.

Gary Short of Gray Station questioned if the Gray Station area was scheduled to receive public sewage in the near future. Vincent DeCario explained this area is in the future plans for construction of public sewage; however, sewage would not be available for approximately 6 to 10 years. Mr. Short was referred to the Derry Township Municipal Authority who handles the public sewage in Derry Township.

Bill Cowan questioned who was responsible for a tree located on Horn Road in Brenizer that was splitting and needs attention. Vincent DeCario stated he would come out to check the situation out on Friday when Mr. Cowan was available and Mr. DeCario would report what he finds to Supervisor Daniel Rullo who is on vacation this week.

Peg Ament thanked Terry Giannini, Code Enforcement Officer, for getting the mess cleaned up at the corner of the Old Latrobe-Derry Road and Wood Street owned by Marcinik and voiced her support for landuse ordinances.
