Minutes, May 7, 2024 Regular Meeting

The regular meeting of the Derry Township Board of Supervisors was called to order in the Municipal Building at 5321 Route 982, Derry, PA at 5:00 p.m. and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Derry Township 2024 Spring Clean-Up Days held on April 19 & 20, 2024 was another huge success. We filled 20 roll-off dumpsters and brought in one tractor trailer load of old tires. The Supervisors would like to thank Westmoreland Cleanways, Salandro's Refuse, our public works and office employees and all the residents that participated.

Grass clippings are not to be left on township roads. First offense will be a warning; second offense, a citation will be issued.

The meeting was opened to the public for comments:

Al Magnone asked about personnel issue during paving project last year, update on new Ordinances, and township mowing of vacant lot in Brenizer. Also asked about the water runoff erosion problem on his property and problem with catch basins on Cherry Street. Discussions were held.

Vince Murphy thanked Don Kepple for sign on Cemetery Road leading to Shrum Field, but asked if there was anything more that could be done about safety/vandalism at the field. A discussion was held.

Mark Piantine, Fire Chief, gave update for the year – the volunteer firemen have responded to 230 calls and have 620 manhours to date, which does not include any training, fundraising, drills, meetings or work nights. Included in their fundraising campaign they have a section regarding the reflective address markers for their homes to help aid in emergency management finding you in a timely manner.
